Consumer Protection (Distance Selling) Regulations 2000

Conditions of Sale

“Distance Selling” means all sales of goods and the provision of services other than face to face including transactions using the Internet, by mail order, telephone, fax and advertising in magazines, newspapers and periodicals:

A customer has the right to cancel an order for goods within 7 working days of receipt of the goods. This 7 days “cooling off” period excludes Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays.

Notification of intention to cancel should be received by the society within the cooling off period, in writing.

“Writing” includes letter, fax and e-mail sent to the society at its nominated address. A telephone call will not be acceptable.

On receipt of due notice within the cooling off period the society will refund the retail sale price of the goods if, but only if, they are returned in a re-saleable condition. The goods are to be cared for by the customer at the customer’s risk.

The cost of returning the goods must be paid for by the customer and will not be paid by the Society. Payment of a refund will be made within 30 days of receipt of the returned goods in a re-saleable condition by the society. Refunds will be made by cheque or re-crediting the customer’s credit card if the original purchase order was made using a credit card.
